Vehicle Refresher and Technology Update (Sat & Sun) Max. Students:30

<u>Course Description:</u> This 16-hour classroom program is designed as a refresher to the Basic Vehicle Rescue Program and to update rescuers on the newest and most current information related to vehicle design; electric, hybrid, and other alternative energy propulsion systems; airbags and other supplemental restraints. The program focuses on the "need-to-know" information for street rescuers so that they can perform a safe and quick patient-oriented rescue in the modern road vehicle.

Prerequisites: BVRT

Fayette County Public Safety Radio System Overview (Thur only)) Max. Students:30

Course Description: This program will provide information relative to Fayette County's transition to the Inter County Regional Radio System (ICORRS) and its impact on the Public Safety users. Basic Firemanship Sat & Sun)

Max. Students:60

<u>Description of Course</u>: This course will introduce the student to basic knowledge and skills used to operate at structure fires. The course serves as an introduction to firefighting and should be used to prepare new members for completion of the Pa. Essentials Course. Course work will include practical drills.

Prerequisites:

Pump Operations I (Sat & Sun)

Max. Students:30

<u>Description of Course</u>: This course provides the fire fighter with an introduction to basic pump construction and theory as well as operating techniques. Emphasis is placed on getting water to the pump, getting water from the pump for hose streams, and prevention of common mistakes in pump operations.

Prerequisites: IST

<u>Student Equipment/Supply Needs:</u> Pen/Pencil, Notebook suitable for classroom and field use. Fire fighter protective clothing.

Responding to Helicopter Emergencies (Sat only)

Max. Students:20

<u>Description of Course:</u>: This class will introduce students to the different types of Helicopters and Helicopter emergencies that the Structural Firefighter may encounter. The types of extinguishing agents and proper fire attack procedures will be discussed and practiced. Crash site operations and victim removal will be discussed and practiced. Program involves live fire scenarios with helicopter simulator.

Prerequisites: ELIF or DHMO/HMO

Student Equipment/Supply Needs: Pen/Pencil, Notebook suitable for classroom and field use. full structural PPE including SCBA and spare cylinder.

Elevator rescue Training (Sat & Sun)

Max. Students:25
